One once said: "Faith does not eliminate questions. But faith knows where to take them"

Who were you before life's situations and circumstances challenged your assumptions and other people told you who you were meant to be? The way we think about ourselves really impacts every area of our lives. The way you think about yourself impacts all areas of your life.

Every decision you make, every day of your life, and every date you hold and place on your calendar.

In the book of Isaiah, the great prophet was writing to the nation of Israel who found themselves in exile. Their identity had been diluted and their temple had been destroyed. Isaiah wanted them to fix their eyes on the truth of God's words rather than the world into which they now lived. A nation in exile.

Isaiah 41:1 is a verse that acknowledges the prophet telling the people that the Lord created and formed them. That God had and continues to have a purpose for them. Delivering and gathering their children from east to west was a reason for them not to fear. He considered them and us honored in His sight. Although they were brought into exile because of their sin and disobedience, the Lord still unconditionally loved them. Although we go astray and sin before God, He still loves us and offers us His peace. This relationship of love was a promise that still holds true today in the person and work of Jesus Christ.

How difficult it must have been for the nation of Israel to comprehend the truths of the prophet's words. Does your life experience cause you to have trouble comprehending the truth of God's word? Although it was their sin that brought them to where they found themselves, they still had to deal with feelings of being forgotten, forsaken and fruitless. God's words from the prophet must have felt like distant platitudes. However, they were fueled with hope, and that hope began to rise in them. Later in Isaiah's book, we read about another promise. This promise exclaimed that God did not forget them and that all of Israel's people were engraved on the palms of His hands.

God wanted the Israelites to know how precious they were in His eyes, and how loved they were by His heart. Now Jesus has come, we are not only precious in Christ's sight; God the Father now sees us as perfected in Christ. Because of Christ's redemptive act on the cross, we have been affirmed, accepted, approved, and acknowledged by grace through faith. Don't be defined by the world, be defined by finding your identity in Christ. You are known, called, loved and chosen.

Rally Day will kick off the Church School and Adult Group year on Sunday, September 11, 2022 at 9AM. Everyone will then go to class for their lessons.

The *Growing in Grace and Gratitude* curriculum we have used for several years appears to be being phased out especially at the older levels. This year the entire Church School and the Adult Group will be using the *Feasting on the Word* curriculum. This is a Presbyterian produced resource which closely follows the Lectionary. Each class, including the adults, will be studying the same part of the Bible each week. We have also purchased a coordinating resource for Pastor Jim with Children's Bulletins and Children's messages with the same theme as the lesson for the day.

Pastor Jim will be offering a Confirmation Class this year and will be contacting families regarding this. A few of our youth having been waiting two years for this class and we will be encouraging them to attend.

Plans are being made for our annual White Gift Service on December 11 during worship. There will be more information in future newsletters.
